The academy received an additional £19240 of funding allocated to enhance physical education (PE). This only covers a proportion of the many sporting activities offered at Stockwell Academy. Many other activities are funded directly from the Academy budget.

The funding has been directed towards 4 areas:

Development – with the aim of developing staff to further improve the quality teaching of PE

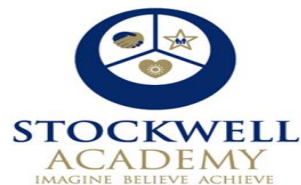
Opportunity – offering pupils opportunities to participate in sports competitions

Legacy – Encouraging pupils to continue sports activity beyond the school.

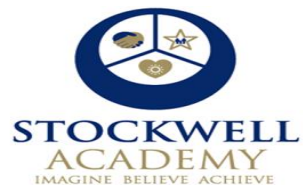
